An Act to issue certain sums of money out of the Public Account towards the service of the year ending with the 31st day of March 1984 (2 August 1983)

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of the Cook Islands, in session assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. Short Title - (1) This Act may be cited as the Appropriation (Imprest Supply) Act 1983.

(2) This Act relates to the year ending with the 31st day of March 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "this year"), and is intended to ensure for the interim the provision of supply for all necessary and proper Government expenditure pending the coming into force of the main Appropriation Act for this year.

2. Grant and appropriation of \$16,160,530 out of the Cook Islands Government Account - (1) In addition to all sums otherwise granted, there may be issued and applied, by way of imprest, towards the service of that part of this year ending with the 31st day of December 1983, out of the Cook Islands Government Account, the amounts specified in the Schedule to this Act, and not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$16,160,530.

(2) All sums issued and applied under this section shall be charged in the manner hereinafter specified in the main Appropriation Act for this year, and, until that Act is passed, may be expended in this year as if they had been appropriated by Act of Parliament.

3. Expenditure - (1) Subject to Article 12 of the Constitution no payments shall be made out of the Cook Islands Government account, pursuant to this Act, otherwise than with the approval of the Financial Secretary who shall approve no payment unless it is essential and proper and is a payment which must be made pending the coming into force of the main Appropriation Act for this year.

(2) While this Act remains in force, the Financial Secretary shall, on the last day of each month furnish a report to the Queen's Representative of all expenditure authorised by him in that month.

(3) The Financial Secretary shall be directly responsible to Parliament for all such payments made and shall provide to Parliament within 30 days of the lapse of this Act an accounting, certified under his hand, together with such explanatory notes as may be necessary, of all expenditure authorised by him pursuant to this Act.

4. Public Moneys Act - Where any provision of this Act conflicts with the provisions of the Public Moneys Act 1969, then the provisions of this Act shall prevail.
