An Act of the Parliament of the Cook Islands to appropriate certain sums of money out of the Cook Islands Government Account to the services of the year ending with the thirty-first day of March 1984, and to appropriate the supplies granted in this year

(26 December 1983

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN, - We Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Parliament of the Cook Islands, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this year, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sum hereinafter mentioned and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Parliament of the Cook Islands in Session assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title - This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act 1983, and relates to the year ending on the thirty-first day of March 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "this year").

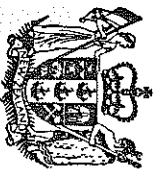
2. Grant and appropriation of \$21,419,100 out of the Cook Islands Government Account - (1) The Minister responsible for Finance may issue and apply out of the Cook Islands Government Account, towards making good the supplies granted to Her Majesty for the services of this year, any sums which do not exceed the sum of \$21,419,100.

(2) The sums hereinbefore authorised to be supplied are appropriated for the services expressed in the several votes specified in the Schedule to this Act.

An Act to Amend the Decimal Currency Act 1964

(16 December 1983)
BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of the Cook Islands in Session assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. Short Title - This Act may be cited as the Decimal Currency Amendment Act 1983 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Decimal Currency Act 1964 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act").

2. Legal Tender - Paragraph (a) of sub section (1) of Section 14 of the principal Act is hereby amended by inserting after the words "ten dollars" (as inserted by Section 2 of the Decimal Currency Amendment Act 1978) and before the words "twenty five dollars" (as inserted by Section 2 of the Decimal Currency Amendment Act 1976 (No.2)) the words "twenty dollars,".

3. Schedule - The Schedule to the principal Act is hereby amended by -

- (a) inserting in the column headed "Denomination of Coin" after the words "Twenty Five dollars" (as inserted by paragraph (a) of Section 3 of the Decimal Currency Amendment Act 1976 (No. 2)) and before the words "Ten dollars" (as inserted by paragraph (a) of Section 3 of the Decimal Currency Amendment Act 1978 the words:

"Twenty dollars"

- (b) inserting in the column headed "Standard Composition" so as to correspond to the words inserted by paragraph (a) of this section the word:

"Silver"
