Order

- 1 Title**
This order is the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities (Extension of More Favourable Treatment) Order 2020.
- 2 Commencement**
This order is deemed to have come into force on 27 March 2020.
- 3 Interpretation**
In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
mission means a diplomatic mission of a State
State means a State listed in the Schedule
- 4 Extension of more favourable treatment**
 - (1) The purpose of this clause is to extend to the States more favourable treatment than required under the Convention, as reciprocated by the States to the Cook Islands.

- (2) It is declared that the missions and their diplomats and consular officers are exempt from the prohibition on importing alcohol into the Cook Islands as unaccompanied goods.
- (3) However, the exemption only applies if the alcohol—
 - (a) meets the reasonable personal requirements of the diplomat or consular officer importing it; or
 - (b) is clearly identified for official use by the mission.
- (4) The Comptroller of Customs has the final authority to determine whether an importation meets either requirement under subclause (3).

5 Revocation

The Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities (Extension of more favourable treatment) Order 2015 is revoked.
