Response: Mr T. Elikana – Yes, it can be shipped to Rarotonga but I will not expand on my answer to prevent the Opposition from writing it in their manifesto.

1. Mr N. Baker question to MP A. Nicholas – Why were the roads in Arorangi not completed in 2016 and instead the road project was moved to Tupapa. Who owns the chip seal machine?

Response: Mr A. Nichoas – The former Deputy Prime Minister, Teariki Heather, who was also the Minister for Infrastructure Cook Islands at the time, stopped the road project in Arorangi. He did not want the roads in Arorangi to be hot sealed but chipped sealed.

Regarding the chip seal machine, I am unsure about the machine so if we can defer this question to tomorrow so I can get the correct answer.

2. Mr V. Tupa question to Hon. G. Angene – Since you are constructing graves around the island for free, would you consider constructing water tanks for free for our people and to start in the village of Matavera.

Response: Hon. G. Angene – Since I am already providing free service to our people to build their graves, tree trimmings, cleaning households for the destitute, yes, I can provide the same service to build water tanks for our people and to train our people.

3. Mr T. Maoate question to Minister for Foreign Affairs, Hon. M. Brown – What is the

Brown – I can confirm that the PR applications closed last Friday and the Immigration team is eliminating those who does not fit in the criteria before proceeding to the next part of the process.
