PURSUANT to Section 34 paragraph (a) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964 and the New Zealand Laws Act 1966, the Queen's Representative acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title - These Regulations may be cited as the Coinage Regulations 1967 (Amendment No.23) 1987 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coinage Regulations 1967 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Five dollars coin - (1) The design for the five dollars coin shall be the Raphael Maklouf effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second and on the obverse side, an impression of a conch shell with the inscription "\$5".

(2) The composition of the \$5 coin shall be copper, aluminium and nickel in proportions of 92 percent, 6 percent and 2 percent respectively.

(3) The diameter and thickness of the \$5 coin shall be 31.65mm and 2.80mm respectively.

(4) The shape of the \$5 coin shall be dodecagonal, with a plain edge.

3. Two dollars coin - (1) The design for the two dollars coin shall be the Raphael Maklouf effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second and on the obverse side, an impression of a kumete pounding table with the inscription "\$2".

(2) The composition of the \$2 coin shall be copper and nickel in proportions of 75 percent and 25 percent respectively.

(3) The diameter and thickness of the \$2 coin shall be 24.20mm and 2.50mm respectively with the diameter being measured from apex to base.

(4) The weight of the \$2 coin shall be 7.62 grams with an allowance of 0.33 grams.

(5) The shape of the \$2 coin shall be an equilateral triangle with rounded corners, with a plain edge.

4. One dollar coin - (1) The design for the one dollar coin shall be the Raphael Maklouf effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second and on the obverse side an impression of the Fertility God "Tangaroa" with two inscriptions of "\$1".

(2) The composition of the \$1 coin shall be copper and nickel in proportions of 75 percent and 25 percent respectively.

(3) The diameter and thickness of the \$1 coin shall be 28.70mm and 2.50mm respectively.

(4) The weight of the \$1 coin shall be 11.0 grams with an allowance of 0.33 grams.

(5) The shape of the \$1 coin shall be circular, with 12 scallops around the edge.
