PURSUANT to section 8 of the Ombudsman Act 1984 the Queen's Representative, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations:

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ORDER

1. Title and commencement - (1) This Order may be cited as the Ombudsman (Remuneration) Order 1994.

(2) This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 9th day of March 1992.

2. Salary - (1) There shall be paid to the Ombudsman during the period set out in the First Schedule the salary and allowances calculated at the annual rates set out in the Second Column of that Schedule.

(2) There shall be paid to the Ombudsman as from the date set out in the First Column of the Second Schedule, the annual salary and allowances set out in the second column of that Schedule.

3. Cost of Living Adjustment - (1) The Ombudsman shall be entitled to such cost of living adjustments which shall be equal to the cost of living adjustments provided from time to time to either public servants or Members of Parliament.

(2) Any cost of living adjustment shall be applied only to the taxable amount set out in the Second Column of the Second Schedule.

4. Leave - (1) The Ombudsman shall be entitled to take 20 days paid leave in any twelve month period, and shall advise the Prime Minister in advance of any such period.

(2) The Ombudsman, his wife and one other member of his family shall each be entitled in each year to one air ticket (first class, or business class if first class is not available) from Rarotonga/Auckland/Rarotonga, for the purpose of spending part of the aforesaid period of leave in New Zealand. A sum of money may not be claimed in lieu of such tickets in any year in which such travel is not undertaken.

5. Motor Vehicle - (1) The Government shall provide and maintain a suitable car for the use of the Ombudsman for the purpose of carrying out his official duties and will meet the running costs, maintenance and repairs of such vehicle.

(2) The importation or purchase of a motor vehicle, imported for the purposes of subsection (1) shall be exempt from customs duty and levy, provided that customs levy will be payable if the vehicle is sold within 3 years of the date of its importation.

6. Validation - The amounts set out in the Schedules shall be deemed to have been validly paid to the Ombudsman in respect of the periods therein set out, as if those payments had been made pursuant to this Order.
