PURSUANT to the Decimal Currency Act 1964 and the New Zealand Laws Act 1966, His Excellency, the Queen's Representative, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title - These regulations may be cited as the Coinage Regulations 1987, Amendment No. 22 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coinage Regulations 1967 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Cook Islands 1987 coins - Notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 2 of the principal regulations the design for the coins to be known as the Cook Islands coins, shall be as follows:

- (a) Fifty cents: The design for the coin made and issued bearing the date 1987 shall be for the obverse impression the Raphael Maklouf portrait of Her Majesty the Queen in profile with the inscription "Elizabeth II Cook Islands" encircling the top and below the date of the year and for the reverse impression a honito swimming and facing left and the figure "50":

- (b) Twenty cents: The same obverse impression as the fifty cents coin described in paragraph (a) of this regulation, and for the reverse impression a fairy tern in flight with a fairy tern perching on a branch in the background and the figure "20":
- (c) Ten cents: The same obverse impression and inscription as the fifty cents coin described in paragraph (a) of this regulation, and for the reverse impression a bunch of oranges and leaves under the figure "10":
- (d) Five cents: The same obverse impression and inscription as the fifty cents coin described in paragraph (a) of this regulation, and for the reverse impression a hibiscus flower and leaves on which is superimposed the figure "5".

3. Number of coins limited - The number of coins to be made and issued of the design described in -

- (a) Paragraph (a) of regulation 2 hereof shall be limited to twenty thousand:
- (b) Paragraph (b) of regulation 2 hereof shall be limited to fifty thousand:
- (c) Paragraph (c) of regulation 2 hereof shall be limited to fifty thousand:
- (d) Paragraph (d) of regulation 2 hereof shall be limited to one hundred thousand.

4. Shape and edge treatment - Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal regulations the coins described in regulation 2 hereof shall be circular with the edge treatment as follows:

- (a) The edge of the 50 cents coin shall have five equally spaced $\frac{1}{4}$ in. plain segments separated by segments with coarse graining:
- (b) The 20 cents, 10 cents, and 5 cents coins shall have graining on the edges.

5. Diameters and standard weights - Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal regulations the diameters and standard weights of the coins described in regulation 2 hereof shall be as set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto: Provided that in the making of the said coins the tolerances set out in Part II of the said Schedules shall be allowed:
